



# Leading Learning Aspiring Primary Middle Leaders

A Primary programme for teachers aspiring to be middle leaders and for current middle leaders who wish to become more effective in their role. The course will involve talks, workshops and practical experience in schools. It will include the completion of a school based improvement initiative.

### Aims of the programme:

- To consider effective monitoring strategies and set priorities in subject leadership.

- Presentation of improvement projects by delegates
