# Our Learning in Year Two

Maths: This half term we will begin by recapping some of the Year 1 objectives for Place Value before moving onto the Year 2 curriculum. Your child will learn to: count forwards and backwards, recognise the value of tens and units in a two-digit number up to 100, represent numbers using practical equipment and pictorial representations and compare and order numbers to 100. Our next unit in maths will be addition and subtraction.

English: This half term we will be learning the story of 'Little Red Riding Hood'; the activities will focus on the four main sentence types and the correct use of nouns and adjectives. Our Non-Fiction unit will involve discussion around the question, 'Should Little Red Riding Hood have listened to her mam?' After half term, we will then move onto a poetry unit, where we will write our own acrostic poems.

#### **Other Curriculum Areas**

Phonics: During phonics this half term, we will focus on the different spellings for the sounds /ae/, /d/ and /ee/. We will also recap some of the Year 1 spellings. Homework spellings will based upon words containing the focus sounds.

History: In History we will be learning all about when, how and why The Great Fire of London happened.

Science: Our first Science topic of the year is all about materials and their properties. We will learn about natural and manmade materials and why some materials are more suitable than others for certain purposes.

P.E: The P.E. this half term will focus on Multiskills and health related fitness.

Music: This half term in Music, we will be learning about 'Time Signatures', thinking about the beat in key songs.

R.E/Personal Development: This half term in R.E. our topic is 'Beginnings'. We will begin by learning the story of Creation.

In Personal Development, we will be using Ten Ten and will cover the topics of 'Religious Understanding' and 'Emotional Well-being'.

Art: We will be completing a drawing unit in Art focusing on 2D and 3D sketches before moving onto Still Life drawing.

Computing: Our topic is 'Algorithms' and we will learn how to write clear, precise instructions for everyday tasks.
