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### **Sickness, Accident and Emergency Procedure**

If your child is ill or unable to attend the After School Club, we would appreciate it if you could contact school on 0191 4832274.

If your child becomes unwell during the session, the parent/carer will be contacted and asked to come and collect the child. Any minor accident your child may have while at the club will be dealt with by a member of staff who will be a trained first aider. All accidents are recorded in the accident book by the first aider. If the accident or illness is more serious, a member of staff will accompany the child to hospital. Parents/carers or emergency contacts will be informed immediately by staff.

### **Policies**

St Aloysius After School Club aims to provide a safe and secure environment. Various policies are in place for the After School Club. They are available to any parent/carer who wishes to look at them. They include: Health and Safety (including Risk Assessment and Fire Drills), Safeguarding and Behaviour Management.

Payments for the whole half-term can be made if parents/carers find this more convenient. **All children should be collected by 5pm.**

**If you know you will be late collecting your child, you must contact a member of the After School Club staff immediately.**

We reserve the right to charge the additional fees for lateness to cover After School Club costs.

## Breakfast Club Payment

### Booking and Cost Information

The office will inform you of the cost of a Breakfast Club place. Parents are encouraged to book their child's place each half-term and payments should be made one week in advance. Payments for the whole half-term can be made if parents/carers find this more convenient.

Payment should be made via ParentPay where possible, however school can accept cash or cheque. (Please contact the school office if you need any help with this)

1. Children attending St Aloysius with a sibling link
2. Children attending St Aloysius



## Breakfast Club Procedures

### Arrival

The Breakfast Club opens at 7.45am and is held at the Junior school.

Parents/Carers **MUST** bring their children in to the dining hall via the Junior school main entrance where breakfast is served. Staff will ask the adult to sign their child/children in for safeguarding purposes.

Please do not send your child in independently.

Parents are not permitted to park in the car park. Access is via the walkway through the Junior car park.

Breakfast will mainly consist of:

- Cereal
- Toast
- Yoghurts
- Fresh Fruit
- Cold drink (Child's preference)



Please let us know if your child has any food allergies by filling in a Disclaimer Form which is required before your child can attend Breakfast club or After School Club.

### Activities

After breakfast the children will be able to access a range of activities planned to keep children active and to add to a positive start to their school day.

### Walking Bus

We operate a 'Walking Bus' from the Junior school to the Infant school.
