Our Uniform

Parent/Carer involvement

We acknowledge the importance of parents/carers as a child's first educator and aim to work together with parents.

Parent workshops

During the course of the year you will be invited to join us for a range of focused workshops. These are intended to support you at home when helping your child to learn and provide an opportunity for us to share some of the strategies we use in our teaching that your child will be familiar with.

Home-School diary

At the beginning of school your child will receive a home-school diary. This is an opportunity for you and your child to record anything they would like to share from home. This may be in the form of photographs, bus/cinema tickets, drawings etc. your child will share this weekly with staff and peers.

Reading together

Supporting your child's reading development is one of the most important things you can do for them over the coming year. Children who read and are read to often at home, make accelerated progress in reading. Reading contributes to all areas of learning across the curriculum.

PTFA
