Our Learning in Year Two

<u>Maths</u>: This term we will be moving onto the unit **Multiplication and Division**. Your child will learn to: recognise and make equal groups, use arrays, divide by 2, double and half a number, and divide by 2,5, and 10. It is important that the children are confident with their 2, 5, 10 and 3 times tables and practise these regularly at home. Our next units in maths will be **Money and Fractions**.

English: This term we will be writing our own non-fiction explanation texts and recounts. We will be reading the story, The Owl Who was Afraid of the Dark. The children will continue to strengthen their grammatical knowledge by using contractions, verbs, adjectives and expanded noun phrases in their independent work.

Other Curriculum Areas

<u>Phonics</u>: During phonics this half term, we will focus on the different spellings for sounds from Sounds Write - Extended Code. Homework spellings will be based upon words containing the focus sounds as well as 2 common exception words which must be learnt each week.

<u>**History:**</u> In history, we will be comparing queens, we will learn about what a monarch is and focussing on Queen Elizabeth II, Queen Victoria and Queen Elizabeth I. We will be comparing the reigns of these three queens and looking at what life was like in Britain during that time.

Science: Our science units will be 'Animals and Living Things' and 'Plants'.

P.E: The P.E. this half term will focus on dance, gymnastics, cheerleading and attack vs defence team games and tactics.

<u>Music</u>: This term in music lessons, we will be learning about time signatures, thinking about the beat in keysongs. The song we will be learning is 'Evening Star', which is in a ¾ time signature. We will also be recreating rhythms similar to the Japanese Gamelan Ensemble using percussion instruments.

<u>R.E/Personal Development</u>: This term in R.E, we will cover the Local Church topic of Books, we will learn a bout the importance of the Bible and the Gospels. In Personal Development, we will be using Ten Ten and will cover the topics of 'Personal Relationships' and 'Life Online'.

<u>Art:</u> We will be looking at sculpture; we will design and make our own African Masks and taking inspiration from Esther Mahlangu.

<u>Computing:</u> Our topic is Computer Networks and we will look at the uses of computers and animations.
