We know that some classes Celebration of the Words clashed, which was hard if sibling events were at the same time, and you only had one family member available. As a school, we have tried to minimise the disruptions in class as your child's education is incredibly important to us. We held sixteen Easter Celebrations of the Word in just one week; we wanted them to be spiritual and held in the classrooms rather than an assembly type of worship so this led to clashes. We held them close to the end of the school day so that families wouldn't have to travel back and forward to school, however, we will consider feedback for next Easter to make the events more convenient.

On a lunch and break time, they are used for those that want to read, draw or just chat. The infant children also now have more tables on the front and back playgrounds. The seats have been purchased through our fundraising money.

#### **Retirement**


