









Pupil Expectations for Google Meet








What do my teachers expect from me on Google Meet?

During this academic year, there may be some periods of time where we need to spend some time apart from one another. This is to keep you, your teachers and your families safe. To make sure that we can all keep in contact with one another, we are going to start to use Google Meet through your Google Classroom account. Google Meet is a really useful tool that will let you see your teacher and hear their voice and get to participate in some online lessons. This will help us to help you to continue to make the amazing progress that you make when you are in school with us!

To make sure that we keep everyone safe when we are online we need your help! Below we have listed some Aloysius rules which we expect you to follow when interacting with Google Meet. Your teachers and parents may talk to you about this so that you have a really good understanding of what you need to do ready for your next online session. Make sure you follow these rules really carefully when you are online to keep everyone safe.

-  When you sign into your Meet session, make sure you are wearing smart casual clothes, this may include your school uniform if you choose to wear this.
-  Make sure you press the 'blur your background' button that we showed you how to use in the tutorial video.
-  Mute your microphone and turn your camera off unless your teacher has asked you to keep it on.
-  Sit in a quiet, public place in your house. By public place we mean your kitchen, living room etc. **Do not** use Meet in your own bedroom.
-  Do not try to record or screen shot the Google Meet. If you do you will be removed from the online session and we will speak to your parents.
-  Be prepared. Make sure you login to your Meet at the right time and have everything you will need (you teachers will tell you this in the information when they share the Meet link).

-  Focus when your teacher is talking. Don't use the chat feature unless you are asked to do so.
-  Stay in one spot during your video call. Remember, the same expectations for behaviour apply when learning online.
-  Turn off all potential distractions. Learning time is for learning not being distracted!
-  Be polite and respectful to your teachers and friends. Wait your turn.
-  Be the best you can be! Only unmute yourself when you are asked to. Put your hand up as you normally would do. Make sure your behaviour is good at all times. Show your teacher how amazing you truly are!
